



The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), the department of the federal government with responsibility for CACFP, has released the new meal reimbursement rates effective July 1, 2022. These rates are the amount of reimbursement per meal/snack, per child that you will receive from July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023.

NOTE: The extra \$0.10 per meal and snack provided by the 'Keep Kids Fed Act' ARE included as part of these published rates. Per the 'Keep Kids Fed Act', all Tier 2/Mixed Tier Family Child Care Homes will be reimbursed at the Tier 1 rate through June 30, 2023.
